Description/Distinguishing Features

The Neighborhood Activator is a planner who excels at community organizing and collaboration. This forward-facing position is within the Planning Division of the Community Planning and Economic Development Department (CPED) and reports to the City Planner. Kalamazoo is home to 22 distinct neighborhoods, each with its own character, history, and strengths—as well as evolving priorities and opportunities. This diversity brings energy and variety to the work, offering the Neighborhood Activator the chance to build relationships, support local leadership, and help shape community-driven solutions.

Examples of Duties

The Neighborhood Activator works closely with neighborhoods, community partners, and other City Departments primarily to:

- support neighborhoods in creating and sustaining organization or associations. This work has a large focus on fostering a strong communication network to support communication between the city and neighborhood leaders as well as neighborhood residents and businesses.
- leads the creation of Neighborhood Plans in alignment with Imagine Kalamazoo, working closely with neighborhood leaders, residents, businesses, and City departments. Responsibilities include community engagement, interdepartmental coordination, plan writing, and managing the plan approval process.
- supports neighborhoods in implementing their adopted plans by connecting them to relevant City departments, fostering community partnerships, and assisting with additional engagement or capacity-building. While not typically leading implementation, this role plays a key part in helping neighborhoods navigate City systems, sustain momentum, and access resources aligned with their goals.

As a result of the strong community relationships built by this position, the Neighborhood Activator also serves as the City's champion for outreach and engagement, lifting up the City's Public Participation Policy, and assisting City Departments with this work. The Neighborhood Activator is a very forward-facing position and is regularly out in the community to facilitate and participate in community activities that support neighborhoods. These meetings may occur in the evening and occasionally on the weekend. Strong public speaking skills, media confidence, excellent organization, active listening, and clear written and verbal communication are essential for success in this role.

The Neighborhood Activator works closely with all Planning Division and CPED staff and other City Departments, especially Parks & Recreation and Public Services. As Kalamazoo is an education city, the Planning Division regularly partners with Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo College, and Kalamazoo Valley Community College for projects, service learning, and internships. The

Neighborhood Activator regularly partners with students for volunteering, neighborhood projects, and engagement activities and may oversee the work of interns or AmeriCorp service members.

- A bachelor's degree in urban planning, geography, urban design, or related field; master's degree preferred.
- 3-5 years minimum experience in urban planning involving regular community organizing or engagement activities. Project management experience is a plus.
- Confidence in public speaking before community members and internal staff teams.
- · Strong listening and conflict resolution skills.
- The ability to facilitate events, specifically outreach and engagement in neighborhoods.
- Working knowledge of Adobe Creative Suite; working knowledge of GIS a plus.
- A willingness to develop new techniques, lead projects in new practice areas, or oversee the use of new tools.
- Understanding of the concepts from Congress of New Urbanism, Smart Growth America, Project for Public Spaces, and other similar best practices
